Main Objectives:

- Work with the board and Executive Director to register players for our programs at the Jets.
- Work with the Division managers to make sure players are rostered to Hockey Canada sanctioned teams.
- Ensure that all Team officials are fully qualified/certified.
- Work with the Treasurer to collect all fees due and payable to the Jets.

2024/2025 Season Summary:

The 2024/2025 season saw a **total registration of 901 players** registered for programs at the Richmond Jets Minor Hockey Association on a total of 51 teams.

Registration for each division as below:

U7 – 125 for 7 teams

U9 – 147 for 9 teams

U11 – 142 for 9 teams (4 Rep and 5 “C” teams)

U13 – 143 for 9 teams (4 Rep and 5 “C” teams)

U15 – 101 for 6 teams (2 Rep and 4 “C” teams)

U18 – 169 for 10 teams (1 Rep and 9 “C” teams)

U21 – 22 for 1 “C” team

Intro to Hockey – 21 participants

Second Shift – 31 participants

Other programs offered were our First Shift program which we subsequently offered a follow up program called “Second Shift”. This was, again, very successful, and hopefully translated into new registrations in the upcoming season.

And we also offered the Ready to Launch program which was like Bauer/Hockey Canada’s First Shift. We were able to provide a full set of equipment and 5 one-hour ice sessions in the summer at a similar cost to First Shift. These families were able to transition and register for our regular program in the fall.

I would like to take this opportunity, as always, to thank the Executive board, our Executive Director, coaches and managers, and the families of the Jets for their support throughout the season.
