AGM REPORT 2026 – Tina O'Connor - REGISTRAR

Main Objectives:

- Work with the board and Executive Director to register players for our programs at the Jets.
- Work with the Division managers to make sure players are rostered to Hockey Canada sanctioned teams.
- Ensure that all Team officials are fully qualified/certified.
- Work with the Treasurer to collect all fees due and payable to the Jets.
- Be support for first time families to the game of hockey

Key Responsibilities:

- Registration of players and rostering onto teams in accordance with PCAHA, BC Hockey and Hockey Canada
- Registration for the following programs were set up this season
 - Regular season registration – New and Returning Players
 - Rep tryouts
 - U18 Rep ID Skate
 - U9 – Intro to Rep hockey skates
 - Rep Program ID skates
 - Summer Camp programs - Skating & Skills
 - Fall Opt-in Skating & Skills
 - Winter Opt-in Skating & Skills
 - Checking Clinics
 - Ready to Launch Registration
 - Second Shift Registration
 - Try Hockey/Try Goalie registration
- Support with Try Hockey Events, First Shift Welcome Event and other off-ice activities.

- Continue to liaise with the city of Richmond on boardroom booking space as well as gym space for dryland or larger events.
- Ensure that all fees have been paid by the participants

2025/2026 Season Summary:

The 2025/2026 season saw a **total registration of 900 players** registered for programs at the Richmond Jets Minor Hockey Association on a total of 53 teams.

Registration for each division as below:

U7 – 119 for 7 teams

U9 – 144 for 9 teams

U11 – 161 for 9 teams (4 Rep and 5 “C” teams)

U13 – 144 for 9 teams (4 Rep and 5 “C” teams)

U15 – 99 for 6 teams (2 Rep and 4 “C” teams)

U18 – 175 for 10 teams (2 Rep and 8 “C” teams)

U21 – 20 for 1 “C” team

Intro to Hockey – 20 participants

Second Shift – 18 participants

Once again, we hosted the First Shift program which we followed up with the “Second Shift” program. The follow up is a requisite to being allowed to host First Shift.

This year we offered the “Ready to Launch” program again, which is like the Bauer/Hockey Canada First Shift program. The key difference is that Ready to Launch provides five sessions over one week (in the summer), allowing participants to transition into our regular program in September, while First Shift offers six one-hour sessions held once a week (during the season).

I would like to take this opportunity, as always, to thank the Executive board, our Executive Director, coaches and managers, and the families of the Jets for their support throughout the season. Enjoy the summer!
